



CCC 2022-2023 College, University, State Service Organization (CU/SSO), and Non-Federation Nonprofit Application Information

Thank you for your interest in applying for the Colorado Combined Campaign (CCC), the workplace giving campaign of State of Colorado government employees. Here is information regarding the process for applying to the 2022-2023 campaign.

First: what qualifies an entity to be defined as a College, University, State Service Organization (CU/SSO) and Non-Federation Nonprofit?

A CU/SSO is an entity that meets several criteria. It has registered as a nonprofit organization in Colorado by obtaining a Certificate of Registration from the Secretary of State; is exempt from federal income tax under Internal Revenue Code 501(a) as described in Section 501(c)(3); is directly associated with a department of the State of Colorado government; and, otherwise meets the criteria established in CCC Bylaws. **New this year is the addition of a classification of charities we call Non-Federation Nonprofits.** These organizations are neither a member of a federation/umbrella nor a CU/SSO, but can clearly document service to the State of Colorado or Colorado communities, and otherwise meet the criteria established in CCC Bylaws. Online application submission through Regpack

The CCC introduced a new way to apply, online through Regpack, in 2021. This system makes it easier and more efficient for all involved (applicants, CCC staff and the CCC Advisory Committee) in each step of the process, from submission to processing, review and acceptance. Simply click on the link and create an account in order to get started.

Requirements: streamlined, fewer items required

Although the online submission process remains the same, what is required has changed. **Whereas in the past nearly 20 items were requested, that number has been lessened by a third, to around a dozen.** Streamlining the application process and making it easier for charities to participate in the campaign is a priority for the CCC Advisory Committee. For consideration, applicants to the CCC will need to provide:

- Organization contact information
- Bylaws certifications

- Narrative responses
 - Programs and activities
 - Key accomplishments
 - Reporting and transparency

- Financial documents and information
 - IRS Form 990 (dated within the past 18 months from December 1, 2021)
 - Proof of GAAP compliance on IRS Form 990 or audit or financial review (dated within the past 18 months from December 1, 2021)
 - Administration/fundraising ratio calculation

- Other key documents and information
 - Nondiscrimination policy
 - Colorado Secretary of State business and charity urls linking to good standing and solicitation registration pages
 - Statement of local presence
 - Nonprofit information worksheet

CCC nondiscrimination policy

As mentioned, CCC Bylaws were revised in November 2021. Now, for inclusion in the CCC, all charitable organizations must ensure and certify that they have a posted notice that summarizes the discriminatory or unfair practices prohibited by the law per Colorado Civil Rights Commission Rules (3 CCR 708). Notice must include contact information for filing a complaint. If the organization has a written nondiscrimination policy, it should be included with its application.

Deadline

All applications must be submitted online using the Regpack system detailed above by midnight on Friday, February 18, 2022.

Process and schedule

Applications will be initially processed by CCC staff in February-March 2022. At its March 2022 meeting, the CCC Advisory Committee will review and approve applications. Any needed follow up for applications will take place in March-April 2022. At its April 2022 meeting, the CCC Advisory Committee will do one last review and approval of applications that required follow up. Applicants will be notified of their status no later than April 2022. The active fundraising campaign will run from September 2022 to January 2023. Applicants will learn of the funds raised on their behalf in the first quarter of 2023. Monthly distributions will begin in the second quarter of 2023 and run for up to 12 months.

Once approved for the 2022-2023 campaign, we'll ask for materials we can use to market your participation in the campaign, such as pictures, videos and logos. Look for more information in the second quarter of 2022.
